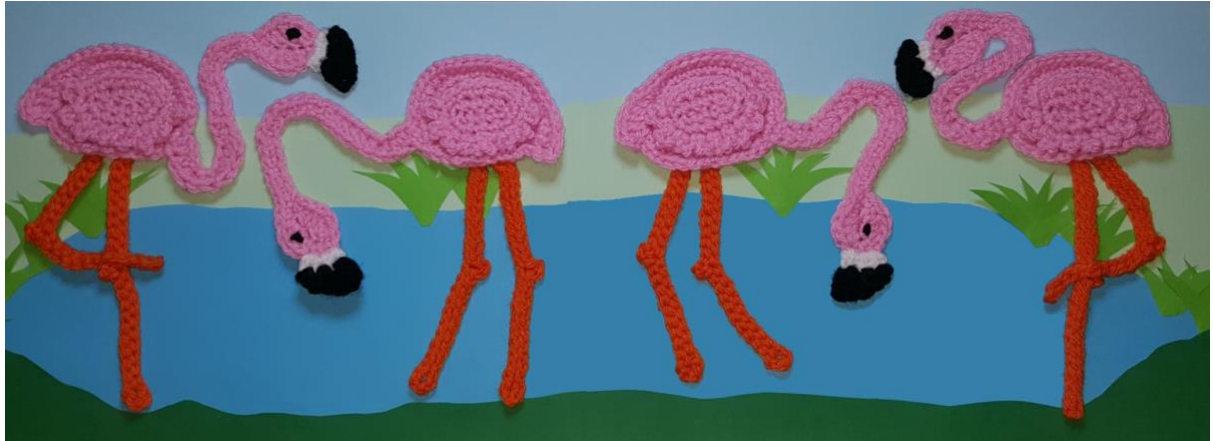

Making disability and art work

Flamboyance participatory art project



Flamboyance is an initiative of an Adelaide-based disability arts sector development organisation Access2Arts, in partnership with the Adelaide City Library, as part of Adelaide LGBTIQ+ FEAST Festival.

As a participatory-art project, Flamboyance invites participants to create crocheted Flamingos to include in a collaborative exhibition of the work as part of Adelaide LGBTIQ+ FEAST Festival. The project seeks to connect people and communities in creating art even while socially distanced as a result of the COVID 19 virus.

Using the pattern people are shown how to crochet their own flamingo figure that they can send to Access2Arts to include in an installation of the community's Flamboyance (FYI - The collective noun to describe a gathering of flamingos is "flamboyance"). The flamingos were designed to be quick to make, easy to post and use a small amount of materials.

Materials

8-Ply acrylic yarn in pink

8-Ply acrylic yarn in black

8-Ply acrylic yarn in white

8-Ply acrylic yarn in orange

3mm – 3.5mm Crochet hook

Scissors

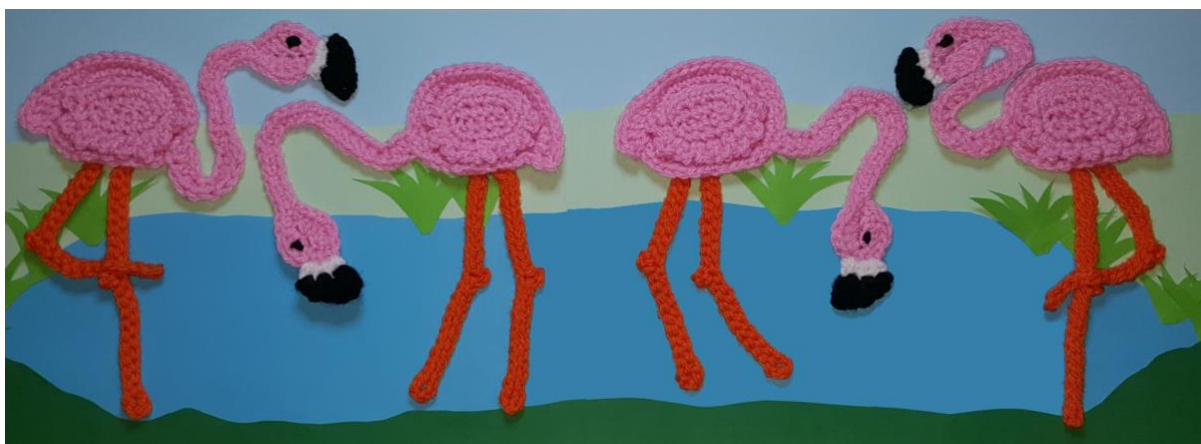

Flamboyance Pattern – Aust/UK pattern

Body A (Left-facing flamingo)

Using pink yarn



Round 1 - 8 dc in magic loop

Round 2 - dc twice in each st (16 total)

Round 3 - dc in first two stitches of round, dc twice in next 4 stitches, dc in next 4 stitches, dc twice in next 4 stitches, dc in next 2 stitches (26 total)

Round 4: - dc in first 3 stitches of round, dc twice in next stitch, dc in next st, dc twice in next 2 stitches, dc in next st, dc twice in next stitch, dc in next 6 stitches, dc twice in next stitch, dc in next st, , dc twice in next 2 stitches, dc in next st, dc twice in next stitch, dc in next 3 stitches (32 total)

Round 5 - s dc in first 4 stitches of round, dc twice in next st, dc in next stitch, ch3, dtc and tc in next st, tc and htc in next stitch, htc in next stitch, dc in next 11 stitches, dc twice in next st, dc in next st, dc twice in next st, dc in next 2 stitches, dc twice in next st, dc in next st, dc twice in next st, dc in next 4 stitches. Slip stich into next st.

Cut tail and weave in ends.

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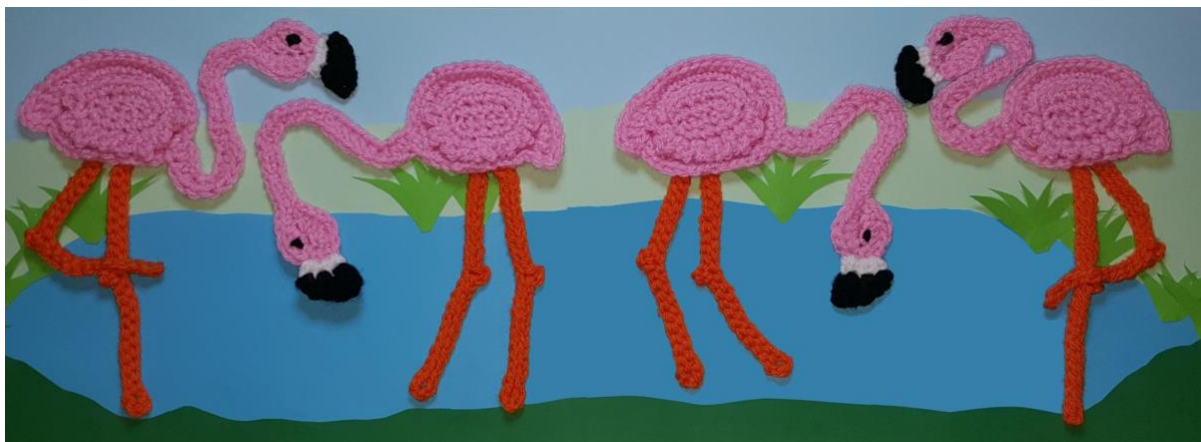

Body B: (Right-facing flamingo)

Using pink yarn



Round 1: 8 dc in magic loop

Round 2: dc twice in each stitch (16 total)

Round 3: dc in first two stitches of round, dc twice in next 4 stitches, dc in next 4 stitches, dc twice in next 4 stitches, dc in next 2 stitches (26 total)

Round 4: dc in first 3 stitches of round, dc twice in next stitch, dc in next st, dc twice in next 2 stitches, dc in next st, dc twice in next stitch, dc in next 6 stitches, dc twice in next stitch, dc in next st, , dc twice in next 2 stitches, dc in next st, dc twice in next stitch, dc in next 3 stitches (32 total)

Round 5: dc in first 4 stitches of round, dc twice in next st, dc in next stitch, dc twice in next st, dc in next 2 stitches, dc twice in next st, dc in next stitch, dc twice in next st, dc in next 11 stitches, htc in next st, htc and tc in next st, tc and dtc in next st, ch3, dc in next st, dc twice in next st, dc in next 4 stitches, slip stitch in to next stitch.

Cut tail and weave in ends.

Flamboyance Pattern – Aust/UK pattern

Neck/Head Version 1 (Use with Body A)

Use pink yarn



Chain 26.

WORKING IN BACK LOOPS OF CHAIN: Htc into of 2nd chain stitch from hook, htc in next ch, htc2tog next 2 ch, htc in next 4 ch, htc twice in next ch, *dc in next ch, dc twice in next ch,* Repeat *to* twice, dc in next 5 ch.

WORKING IN OUTSIDE LOOP OF CHAIN (See Diagram): dc in next 2 ch, htc and tc in next ch, tc and htc in next chain, dc in next ch, ch1.

WORKING IN INSIDE LOOP OF CHAIN (See Diagram): dc in next ch, htc and tc in next cha, tc and htc in next ch, dc in next chain, slip stitch into next ch.

Cut tail and weave in ends.

Neck/Head Version 2 (Use with Body A)

Using pink yarn



Chain 28.

WORKING IN BACK LOOP OF CHAIN: Htc into of 2nd chain stitch from hook, htc in next ch, *htc2tog next 2 ch, htc in next ch*, Repeat *to* twice, htc in next 2 ch, dc in next 5 ch, dc twice in next ch, dc in next ch, dc twice in next chain, dc in next ch.

WORKING IN OUTSIDE LOOP OF CHAIN (See Diagram): dc in next 2 ch, htc and tc in next ch, tc and htc in next chain, dc in next ch, ch1.

WORKING IN INSIDE LOOP OF CHAIN (See Diagram): dc in next ch, htc and tc in next cha, tc and htc in next ch, dc in next chain, slip stitch into next ch.

Cut tail and weave in ends.

Neck/Head Version 3 (Use with Body B)

Using pink yarn



Chain 28.

WORKING IN BACK LOOP OF CHAIN: Htc into of 2nd chain stitch from hook, htc in next ch, htc twice in next ch, htc in next 4 ch, htc2tog in next 2 ch, dc in next ch, *dc2tog in next 2 ch*, Repeat *to* twice, dc in next 6 ch

Cut tail and weave in ends.

Neck/Head Version 4 (Use with Body B)

Using pink yarn



Chain 26.

WORKING IN BACK LOOP OF CHAIN: Htc into of 2nd chain stitch from hook, htc in next ch, htc twice in next ch, htc in next ch, htc twice in next ch, htc in next 4 ch, dc in next 2 ch, *dc in next ch, dc2tog in next 2 ch* Repeat *to* twice.

WORKING IN OUTSIDE LOOP OF CHAIN (See Diagram): dc in next 2 ch, htc and tc in next ch, tc and htc in next chain, dc in next ch, ch1.

WORKING IN INSIDE LOOP OF CHAIN (See Diagram): dc in next ch, htc and tc in next cha, tc and htc in next ch, dc in next chain, slip stitch into next ch.

Cut tail and weave in ends.

Flamboyance Pattern – Aust/UK pattern

Beak

Using white yarn: Insert hook into stitch at front of head, ch 1, htc into 3 stitches at front of head

Using black yarn: dc in first htc, htc and dc in next st, dc twice in next st.

Cut tail and weave in ends.

Wing

Using pink yarn: Chain 5

Round 1: Working in outside loops dc into 2nd chain stitch from hook, dc into next 3 outside loops of chain, ch 1, Working in inside loops dc into next 4 inside loops of chain.

Round 2: dc twice in chain stitch from start of previous round, dc twice in next stitch, dc once in next 2 stitches, dc twice in next 3 stitches, dc once into next two stitches, dc twice into next stitch.

Round 3: dc into first stitch of previous round, slp into next stitch, ch 4, slp into same stitch, Repeat to 7 times

Straight leg

Using orange yarn: chain 24, slip stitch into 4th chain stitch from hook, slip stich into next 9 chain stitches, ch2, slip stitch into same stitch, slip stitch into all remaining stitches

Flamboyance Pattern – Aust/UK pattern

Bent leg

Using orange yarn: chain 24, slip stitch into 4th chain stitch from hook, ch 2, skip next 2 chain stitches and slip stitch into next 7 chain stitches, ch2, slip stitch into same stitch, slip stitch into all remaining stitches.

Assembly

Using pink yarn: whip stitch the base of neck to the lower part of the body. Weave in ends.

Using pink yarn: whip stitch across middle of wing attaching it with ruffled edge at bottom of wing.

Whip stitch legs to back of body using tails from leg pieces. Weave in ends

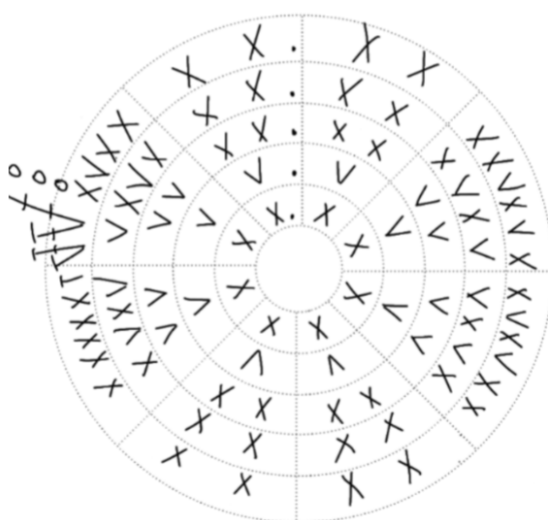

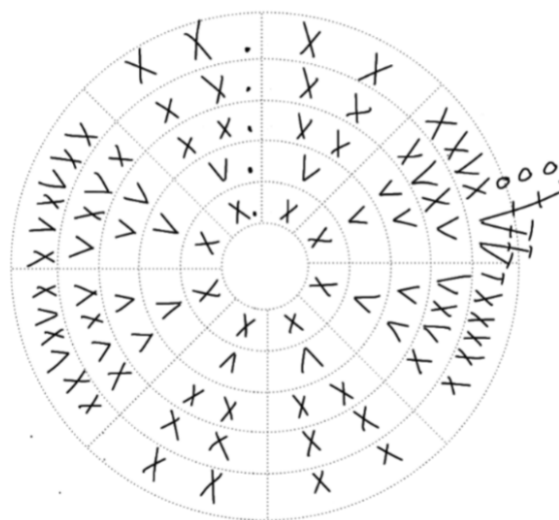

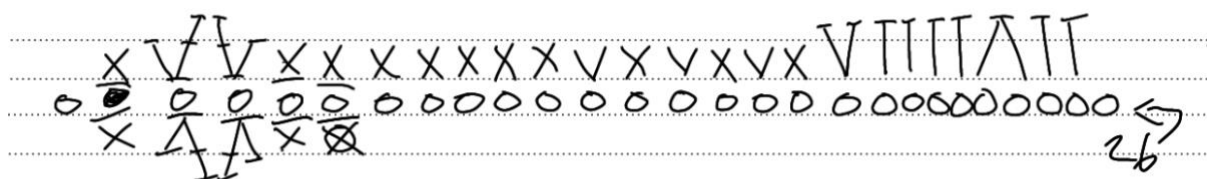


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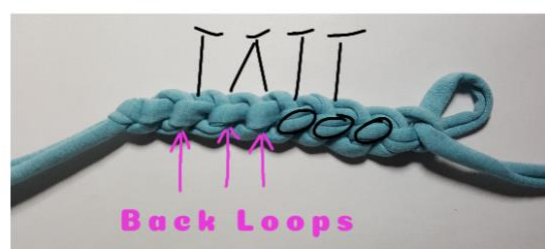
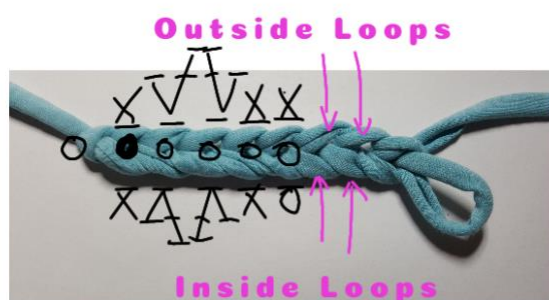
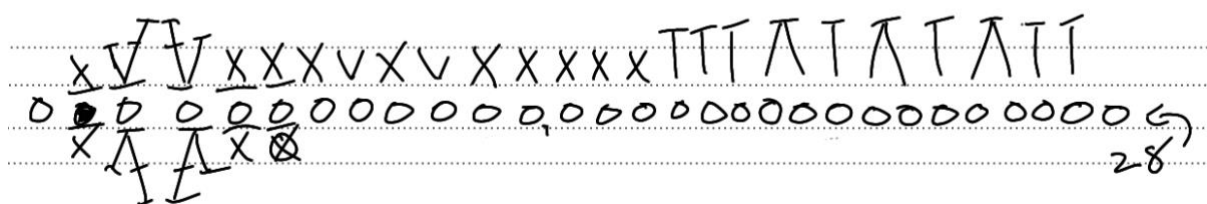

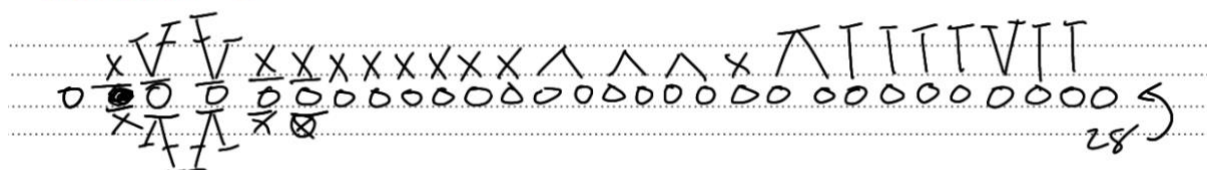

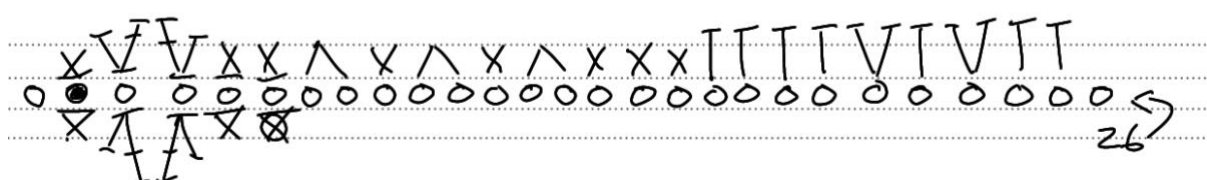

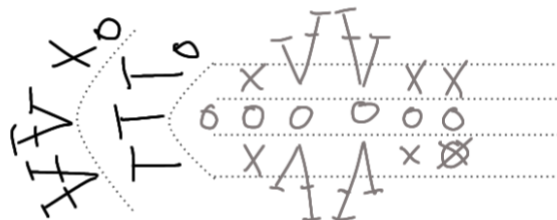

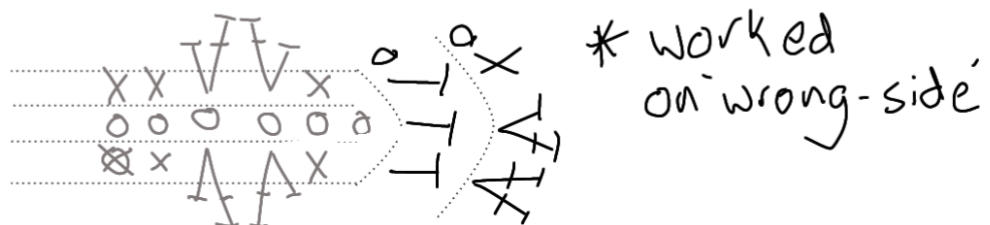
